GOODWILL SCHOLARSHIP DESCRIPTION

The Scholarships will be awarded to incoming undergraduate transfer students. Scholarship recipients will be chosen based on the quality of their **International Goodwill Project** proposal and recommendation letters. The \$1,000 award will be distributed after the start of the fall semester. Receipt of the award is contingent on successful completion of the proposed goodwill project during the student's first semester. This scholarship is not renewable. All scholarship applicants must have submitted an admission application to SDSU and be eligible for admission to SDSU.
