## SDSU EXCHANGE

As an exchange student, you are changing places with a student abroad. You pay fees for that student and he or she pays fees for you. If you are on financial aid, it can apply. Most majors can be accommodated. Semester or full year programs are available depending on location. At least a 2.5 GPA is required.

Applications are due by January 15 of each year for fall; August 15 for spring for priority consideration.

## CSU INTERNATIONAL PROGRAMS

The CSU International Programs will guarantee you credit for all coursework successfully completed. However, how the credit applies to specific requirements depends on campus rules, so it's important that you see a study abroad advisor. Special assistance for IP students includes obtaining visas, arranging transportation and housing, and CSU academic advising at world-renowned overseas universities. All programs are one year in length to provide complete immersion and language development. A 2.75 GPA is required. From Australia to Zimbabwe, you're sure to find the right fit for you.

Applications for most of the CSU International Programs are due February 1 of each year. Exceptions include Australia and New Zealand, which are due May 1.

## SDSU INTERNATIONAL BUSINESS PROGRAM

The SDSU International Business Program is the largest undergraduate program of its kind in the nation and one of the most rigorous. Unlike other business programs which require little in the way of language fluency or cultural studies, the International Business interdisciplinary major includes the equivalent of a minor in a language and five courses in regional studies to complement the core of business classes. Students

are required to spend a semester abroad, either studying or interning in a wide choice of countries.

Students can also receive a dual degree through one of two unique programs:

MEXUS, which allows students to take courses at SDSU and a number of Mexican universities; or,

CaMexUS, which offers SDSU students a combined degree through attendance at both Canadian and Mexican universities.
